Water Front Volunteer

Assist with weekend sailing programs ensuring that museum boating and safety etiquette policy is followed; responsible for checking out and in museum's watercraft to qualified Friends of the Museum patrons. Ensures boats and equipment are in working order and properly secured at the end of use. Assist museum staff and boathouse volunteers with minor maintenance on in-use boats.

Lighthouse Docent

Docents will greet visitors and provide information about museum programs, exhibits, the Marshes Light and the regions maritime history. In addition, docents will assist with gift shop sales.

Volunteer Skipper

Experienced skippers are needed to operate the museum's shad boat, sharpie and other traditional watercraft during the museum's "Shallowbag Bay sail about" rides and other traditional watercraft programs. Skippers are responsible for the operation and safe handling of the museum's watercraft while underway.

Volunteer Crewmembers

Volunteers are needed to serve as crew aboard the museum's shad boat, sharpie and other traditional watercraft.

Boathouse Volunteer

Volunteers are needed for a variety of building and restoration projects. Boathouse volunteers assist museum staff with maintenance on in-use watercraft, constructing and repairing docks, watercraft restoration and construction and with general facilities and grounds repairs and improvements. Boathouse volunteers also assist with waterfront and docent activities.
